**GENITIVE:** si le Possesseur est: 1 personne → Possesseur + 'S + Possédé

2 personnes → PossesseurS +' + Possédé

1 ou 2 choses / animaux → The Possédé(s)+ OF + the Possesseur(s)

<u>SUBJECT PRONOUNS</u>: are used to say WHO or WHAT DOES the ACTION OBJECT PRONOUNS: are used to say WHO or WHAT UNDERGOES the ACTION

EXAMPLE: THEY are looking at ME

**POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES**: are used before a noun.

EXAMPLE: THIS IS MY BOOK.

**POSSESIVE PRONOUNS**: are not used before a noun.

**EXAMPLE: THIS BOOK IS MINE** 

**GENITIVE**: 1) we use **('S)** to show that something belongs to a **PERSON**.

⇒ SINGULAR ('S)

EXAMPLE: This is **PETER'S BROTHER**. Possesseur + 'S + Possédé

⇒ PLURAL (')

EXAMPLE: This is **THE BOYS' BALL** PossesseurS +' + Possédé

2) we (OF) to show that one thing belongs to another THING.

EXAMPLE: Go to THE END OF THE STREET. The Possédé + OF + the Possesseur
